PREPARATION FOR CAMP: WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

We have a range of camp activities plus a field trip planned. During recreation time, our head counselor and a lifeguard are usually down at the lake, so students may swim, use camp watercraft, simply choose to enjoy the beauty, sketch, write, or observe local plant and animal life. Meanwhile, our staff members will organize team sports, chess tournaments, tug-o-war and many other recreational activities.

SPENDING MONEY

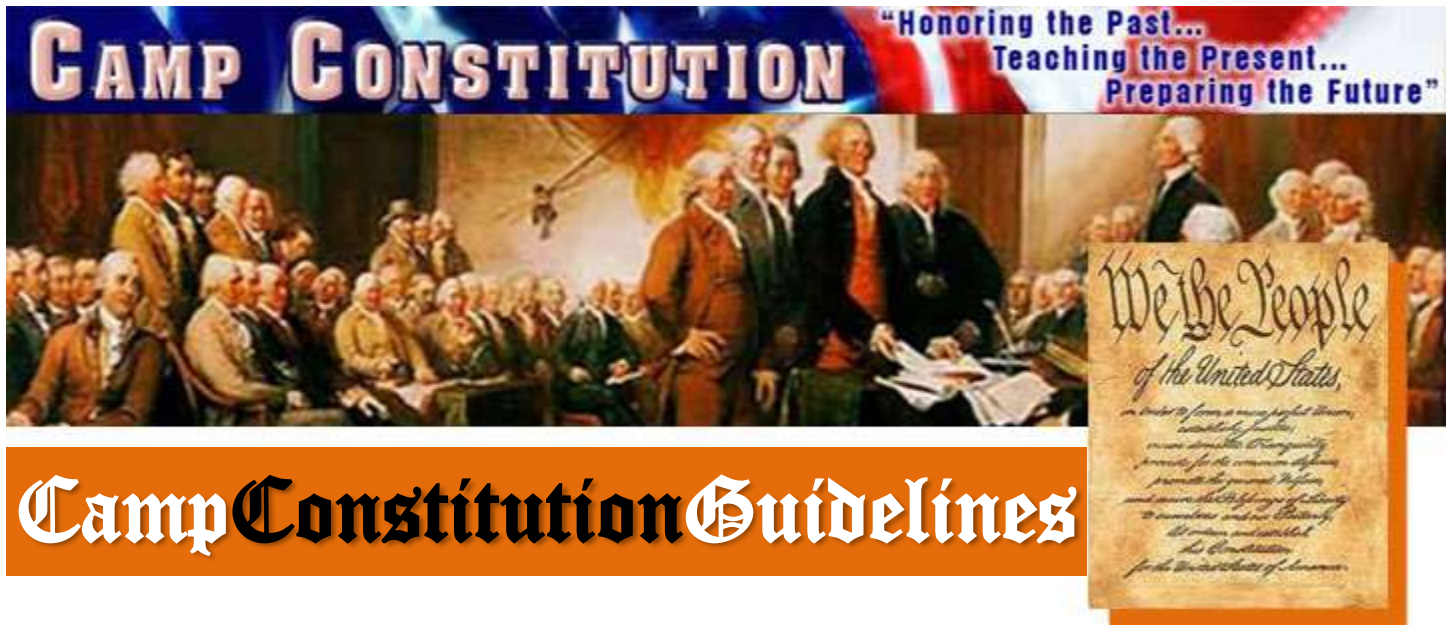
While meals, lodging, classroom materials and most recreational costs are covered by the tuition fee, we recommend that regular campers bring at least \$40.00* There will be opportunities to purchase things such as a camp group photo, special admissions on certain fieldtrips, souvenirs from historical sites, postcards, etc., Our onsite bookstore offers books, DVDs, T-shirts, etc. There will be snack items from time to time, and pizza to enjoy on the final night of camp. (* If the camper is a book lover, adjust accordingly.)

CHECK-IN: Camp Check-in begins the first day of camp from 4:00 – 5:30 PM at Toah Nipi, 252 Old Ashburnham Road off Rte.119 east of Rindge, New Hampshire. **CHECK-OUT:** The final day of camp from 10:00 – 11:00 AM.

MEDICATIONS: Our Camp doctor and/or nurse should be notified of all meds needed for a camper. The medication should be stored with the medical staff and administered by them. Be sure to notify and discuss these issues at check-in.

Camp Constitution Guidelines

CAMP WEAR:

Dress code is strictly enforced. If the Camp Director or other staff members determine that inappropriate attire is being worn, the camper will be asked to change. Obstinacy in this regard could result in expulsion from camp.

Appropriate: Shorts (but nothing that comes above mid-thigh). Jeans, khakis, running pants, & other athletic apparel, T-shirts, polo shirts, tank tops (females: **NO** low-cut tops) Modest Swimwear (ladies, one-piece) gentlemen: boxer-style) If there is any doubt about acceptability of swimwear, **bring alternatives!**

Inappropriate: Clothing with inappropriate or suggestive messages, or referencing drugs/alcohol/rock bands/profanity; No bikinis, spandex, or Speedo-style swimwear.

RECOMMENDED ITEMS TO BRING: *(Laundry facilities NOT available)*

Appropriate clothing to last a week:

- Dress Apparel and Shoes for final evening banquet / graduation
 - Ladies: Dress, (or) Skirt or Dress Pants with Blouse
 - Gentlemen: Dress Pants with collared Shirt , Tie; dress shoes if available.
- Shorts (but nothing that comes above mid-thigh)
- Polo Shirts, T-Shirts, Tank Tops (females: NO low-cut tops)
- Swimwear (Modest!) If in doubt, bring an alternative!
- Sturdy pair of sneakers / shoes that can get dirty!
- Toiletry items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush & paste, deodorant...)
- Sunscreen and bug repellent
- Flashlight and extra batteries (Trail down to the lake for campfire is dark!)
- Spending money **Suggested minimum = \$40.00** (camp photo; T-shirt, books, DVDs, souvenirs, postcards, snacks; pizza party)
- Sweatshirt(s) / Hoodies
- Long pants / Jeans
- Pajamas
- Socks and Underwear
- Water-Resistant Jacket
- Beach Towel / Bath Towel(s)
- Flip-Flops / Water Shoes;
- Sleeping bag / twin-size bedding
- Pillow!
- NOTEBOOK & PEN (or pencils)

OPTIONAL ITEMS TO BRING:

- Musical instrument
- Campfire Props (Skit Items)
- Sketchbook
- Art Supplies
- Cabin Decoration Items (streamers, balloons, images, painters tape). **Be creative !!!**
- Sports Equipment
- Board Games
- Ordinary Playing Cards
- Camera, Case and Batteries
- memory stick/card or film

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- No firearms
- No Fireworks
- No tobacco of any kind
- No Alcohol
- (If cell phones are brought, they will need to be turned in to cabin counselor / parent, and only used with permission.)
- No body piercing
- No Non-Prescription Drugs of Any Kind
- Inappropriate tattoos must be covered
- Alarm Clocks may NOT use Radio
- No noisemakers
- No Music Players
- No immodest clothing
